### Question 5

**The department believes the keyed answer (C) is correct.** The question is not misleading and is quoted from the source material.

### Question 21 (3)

**The department believes the keyed answer (C) is correct.** The answer is directly quoted from the source material. The other answers are not correct.

### Question 22

**The department believes the keyed answer (D) is correct.** Answer C is not the best answer – it says games that have no ending, then states it will stretch into the future of an indeterminate amount of time, which is counter to the prior sentence that says games that have no ending.

**The department believes both answers A and D are correct.**

### Question 29 (2)

**The department believes the keyed answer (C) is correct.** The question is quoted directly from the textbook. Answer A is incomplete. Per the author, we can only choose how we play the game (One way of how we play is deciding if we play or not). The answer A “Whether we play” does not fit with the sentence “We can only choose \_\_\_\_\_”.

Question 51

**The department believes that the keyed answer (D) is correct.** The question asks which of the following is NOT one of the measurements used to define. Answers A,B, and C are all listed in Texas Penal Code as measurements used to define alcohol concentration.

Question 89

**The department believes that the keyed answer (D) is correct.** The General Order 1310 was updated in late January 2026, which moved the term “preponderance of evidence” to a different general order. At the time of the exam, the general orders that were in use for the exam were those that had an effective date as to the 91<sup>st</sup> day before the promotional examination was held, which would have been mid November 2025.
