SUBJECT

Hold a public hearing and consider making a recommendation to City Council regarding a proposed revision to the Denton Development Code; amendments include but are not limited to Table 5.2-A: Table of Allowed Uses, Section 5.3.4: Public, Institutional, Religious, and Civic Use-Specific Standards, Table 7.9-I: Minimum Required Off-Street Parking, and Section 9.2: Definition related to privately-owned cemeteries. (DCA23-0011a, Private Cemetery Use, Cameron Robertson)

BACKGROUND

With the passage of House Bill (HB) 783 as part of the State's 88th Regular Legislative Session, changes related to cemeteries in certain municipalities and counties were adopted in the Texas Health and Safety Code allowing for the establishment of private cemeteries within the City due to the population of Denton County. Prior to the passage of HB 783 privately owned cemeteries were not permitted in or within four miles of the boundaries of the City of Denton due to the City's population size.

HB 783 states that an individual, corporation, partnership, firm, trust, or association is permitted to establish or use a cemetery in a municipality that is located in:

- 1. A county with a population of more than 750,000; or
- 2. A county adjacent to a county with a population of more than 750,000.

Beyond the items specified above, HB 783 states that an individual, corporation, partnership, firm, trust, or association may file a written application with the governing body of a municipality to establish or use a cemetery located inside the limits of the municipality. The governing body by ordinance shall prescribe the information to be included in the application. The governing body by ordinance may authorize the establishment or use of the cemetery if the governing body determines and states in the ordinance that the establishment or use of the cemetery does not adversely affect public health, safety, and welfare.

Given that the City does not presently recognize the land use or regulate private cemeteries, Staff is initiating an amendment to the Denton Development Code (DDC) to comply with the recently adopted state statute. Staff has identified areas within the DDC in which private cemeteries need to be regulated and need to be defined to comply with HB 783. In addition, those cemeteries that presently exist within City limits, that are not owned and operated by the City or State, were analyzed as part of the amendment to ensure that existing privately-owned cemeteries within the City limits would become legally conforming with the implementation of these changes, meaning that the owners of the cemeteries would be able to make improvements to the properties in the future.

The existing privately-owned cemeteries within the City limits are (see Exhibit 5):

- Blue Mound Cemetery
- Old Alton Cemetery
- Pagetown Cemetery
- Roselawn Memorial Cemetery
- Shiloh Cemetery
- Trinity Cemetery

These existing privately-owned cemeteries are located on properties zoned Rural Residential (RR), Residential 2 (R2), and Mixed-Use Regional (MR). So, in addition to proposing to add the privately-owned cemetery use to most of the zoning districts where Funeral and Internment Facilities are already permitted, Staff is proposing to add the use to the RR and R2 Districts. Note that the use is proposed to require approval of a Specific Use Permit in all districts where it would be permitted.

Therefore, several amendments are being proposed to DDC Table 5.2-A: Table of Allowed Uses, Section 5.3.4: Public, Institutional, Religious, and Civic Use-Specific Standards, Table 7.9-I: Minimum Required Off-Street Parking, and Section 9.2: Definitions related to the establishment of a private cemetery use.

The proposed text amendments to Table 5.2-A: Table of Allowed Uses of the DDC are as follows: (proposed additions are shown in underline text)

The proposed text amendment to Subsection 5.3.4. Public, Institutional, Religious, and Civic Use-Specific Standards is as shown below.

5.3.4I: Cemetery, Privately-Owned

1. <u>A privately-owned cemetery shall comply with the Texas Health and Safety Code Title 8, Subtitle C, Chapter 711, as amended.</u>

- 2. A privately owned cemetery shall comply with rules adopted pursuant to Texas Health and Safety Code Title 8, Subtitle C Section 711.012, as amended.
- 3. A privately-owned cemetery may not be maintained in a manner that adversely affects public health, safety, or welfare.

The proposed text amendment to Subsection 9.2: Definitions is as follows

9.2 Definitions: Cemetery, Privately-Owned

A place, established by an individual, corporation, partnership, firm, trust, or association, that is used or intended to be used for interment, and includes a graveyard, burial park, mausoleum, or any other area containing one or more graves.

With the above changes, the City will have the ability to allow the establishment or use of private cemeteries within City-limits, which were not previously regulated nor permitted by code.
