BACKGROUND

Beaver Creek HOA, INC., is the owner of a tract of land located in the Victor E. Gailer Survey, Beaver Creek Phase 3, Abstract No. 452 an addition to the City of Denton, Denton County, Texas. Parks and Recreation staff approached Beaver Creek HOA, Inc. to express the acquisition of 5.69 acres as a public access easement for the creation of the future trail project "Hills at Denton". The trail's vision is to connect from FM 428 to Bonnie Brae St. creating a safe 10-12' trail system for the local community with access to a linear park. Accepting this parcel will support the City's 10-minute walk initiative by increasing the current percentage by one percent. Additionally, this parcel will help preserve open space in reference to the Parks Master Plan.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends approval.

ESTIMATED SCHEDULE OF PROJECT

Staff is currently working with the Real Estate team to acquire easements on the remaining parcels along the Hills of Denton Trail and anticipates the acquisition of the trail to be completed by end of year. Once property is acquired, the City will begin design and construction of trail.

Easement will be donated to the City of Denton at no charge.


"Hills of Denton" Conceptual Trail Alignment

BACKGROUND

On April 19, 2024, Council Member Meltzer requested information regarding "Low Mow" and "Wildflower Areas" within the city park system. In December 2020, Parks and Recreation presented a plan to reduce mowing and establishing wildflowers in select areas.

Staff attempted initial plantings at Robertson/Bell, Eagle/Elm, Windsor/Bonnie Brae and North Lakes Park, but Bermuda grass continues to compete with the wildflowers, thus reducing the success. Some of these areas are no longer being utilized as wildflower areas. Staff has re-seeded the Robertson/Bell area annually as well as attempted to eliminate the bermudagrass with minimal success.

Earlier this Spring, Parks and Recreation, along with Fire, conducted controlled burns at North Lakes Park and the Clear Creek Natural Heritage Center. Wildflower seed was spread across the impacted area to h

In the Spring of 2024, staff created an area along Cooper Creek/Old North Rd. as a "Low Mow" area. While this area has just recently stopped mowing to allow the grass to grow, staff will continue to monitor its success and feedback from the community.

Over the last few years, in cooperation with the Fire Department, Parks and Recreation have completed a number of controlled burns to help stimulate the growth of wildflowers. This Spring, controlled burns were conducted at both the Wildflower Trail in North Lakes Park and the Clear Creek Natural Heritage Area. The areas were overseeded with wildflower seed. Staff continues to monitor the success of these plantings.

With new leadership in Park Planning and Operations, staff will revisit the overall plan that was originally presented to City Council and Park Board and provide an update over the next few months to allow time for additional research and outreach to other municipalities.

OPTIONS

- Do not support the development of a Wildflower Program.
- Support staff efforts to pursue development of a Wildflower Program with a phased approach, beginning with 10-20 acres.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends support to pursue a Wildflower Program.

• Research: 2024/2025

• Implementation: Summer/Fall 2025

• Maintenance: Ongoing

FISCAL INFORMATION

Based upon discussions with other cities in the DFW Metroplex who have developed a wildflower program, it is estimated that the cost to establish native planting areas is between \$1,000 and \$1,200 per acre.

SUBJECT

Consider recommending adoption of an ordinance of the City of Denton adopting a schedule of fees, updating the existing charges and fees for use of city owned property and facilities, and for city services provided at or by parks and recreation; superseding prior fee schedules; providing severability and repealer clauses; and providing an effective date.

BACKGROUND

The schedule of fees is adopted by ordinance each year through the budget process. The schedule of fees outlines the cost to users for utilizing certain park facilities and amenities. Examples include facility, park, pavilion, and athletic field rentals, as well as most aquatics admissions and programs. The fees are set in accordance with the amount of direct and indirect costs incurred by the Parks and Recreation department to offer the service and the appropriate subsidy level as determined by PARD's Subsidy and Resource Allocation Model (Exhibit 3). Some recreation fees are set based on the program or services by independent contractors. The Parks and Recreation Department programs, leagues, and childcare fees vary and are periodically benchmarked to ensure prices are within the market's range. These fees are published in PARD's on-line registration program and Play Guide.

PARD staff conducted a comprehensive review of the schedule of fees and updated the schedule to reflect fees for new amenities and added clarification, where needed, for current fees. A redlined version of the fees (Exhibit 4) provides a detail of changes.

In 2019 and 2021, PARD staff hired a consultant to evaluate the current cost recovery. The cost recovery study helped determine how Denton's recreation programs and services can be priced and managed to operate cost-effectively while ensuring that fees for programs and services are realistic.

During the Fall of 2023, Parks and Recreation staff reviewed the cost recovery continuum and updated all program budget allocations. The process and updates were shared and discussed with the Finance Department for consideration. The 2024-2026 Subsidy and Resource Allocation Plan for the Parks and Recreation Department was presented to the Parks, Recreation, and Beautification Board on April 1, 2024, and was recommended for approval with a 5-0 vote.

OPTIONS

Recommend, recommend with edits, or not recommend.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends approval of the proposed FY 2024-25 Schedule of Fees.

PRIOR ACTION/REVIEW (COUNCIL, BOARDS, COMMISSIONS)

Feb. 3, 2020: Parks, Recreation and Beautification Board recommended approval of the adoption of the Subsidy and Resource Allocation Policy for the Parks and Recreation Department with a (7-0) vote.

Mar. 3, 2020: City Council approved Resolution 20-288 adopting the Subsidy and Resource Allocation Policy for the Parks and Recreation Department with a (5-0) vote.

July 10, 2023: Parks, Recreation, and Beautification Board recommended for approval of the schedule of fees with a 5-0 vote. Changes to the Schedule of Fees are reviewed annually as part of the budget process.

FISCAL INFORMATION

New fees will result in an addition of approximately \$65,780 in revenue to help offset increased operating expenses.



Many program fees are set by independent contractors. Parks and Recreation led programs, leagues, events, and childcare fees vary and are periodically benchmarked. Per Code of Ordinances Chapter 22-28, the fee shall be based on the cost of providing the event, service, equipment, or goods.

BACKGROUND

This item is to gather feedback and provide updates on the ongoing, new, and proposed public art projects.

Original Denton District - Traffic Box Wraps

City staff and with the help of their installation and printing contractors have completed the installation of the 17 boxes that were initially supported with TCA funding in FY 23-24. The first ten boxes in this program feature art by students from Denton-area high school. The recently installed traffic boxes feature Denton Senior Center member artwork, a Jude Landry design adapted from the graphics he created for the Design Downtown Denton initiative, and TWU student art. These new traffic boxes are located at Carroll/Congress, Elm/McKinney, Bell/Administration, and Bell/Chapel. (Exhibit 2 - Landry Traffic Box Wrap)

For FY2024-25 Denton Parks and Recreation are requesting an additional \$15,000.00 Hotel Occupancy Tax funding to support additional vinyl art wraps on traffic boxes and other infrastructure boxes. Project completed.

"Serve" sculpture at Denton Tennis and Pickleball Center

Ms. Sanders attended to some very minor issues with her sculpture 'Serve" at the Tennis and Pickleball Center and left some spare paint samples to help with possible future repairs. Additionally, Ms. Sanders provided the transfer of ownership document to City staff for the "Serve" sculpture. Project completed.

Sycamore Street Bridge Mural

City Staff have tentatively scheduled a June 16-17 date for Kirk Seese to come to Denton and paint his design onto the Sycamore Street Bridge. Mr. Seese will be applying his design to both interior sides of the bridge as well as the southern face of the bridge that faces toward park space at Carl Young Sr., and Fred Moore Parks. As a reminder, Seese's design will feature a foreground of large monarch butterflies against a muted, and delightfully "out-of-focus" background of vegetal greenery. The mural theme was developed as a result of conversations with the Southeast Denton Neighborhood Association and the ALH Senior Center Women's Prayer Group, with both groups substantially favoring this theme over others.

S. Bonnie Brae Sculpture

Robert Barnum recently installed his sculpture, *Deer Moon*, along a trail on Bonnie Brae just north of Vintage Boulevard in Southwest Denton. Robert Barnum's design responds to the design brief which asked for a sculpture design that provided a sense of North Texas "riparian flora and fauna." The final design features a tree made out of CORTEN steel that is foregrounded by an aluminum buck, hawk, and full moon. The sculpture is situated within a landscaped border which will eventually include river rock and tall prairie grass, echoing the riparian theme of the work itself. (**Exhibit 2 - Installation Photographs**)

Barnum's proposal was approved by a subcommittee of the PAC and by the entire committee at the June 2023 meeting. The design is amenable to evening illumination, which Parks and Recreation staff intend to add to the piece in a future project phase.

National Humane Alliance Fountain

Restoration of the City's Herman Lee Ensign Fountain (ca. 1910) is currently on hold awaiting the finalization of the concepts for Downtown Denton and Quakertown Park.

Encounters with Art

City Staff have issued payments to artists performing under the city match component of funds allocated for the Encounters with Art program. As a reminder, this program came to an early close when City Staff had some irreconcilable concerns regarding the TCA grant contract. Project complete.

Halloween, Texas

Parks and Recreation Staff are working to help facilitate a month-long calendar of events for October that will put Denton on the map as a premier, national destination or Halloween-related entertainment. Staff have currently reallocated approximately \$75,000.00 from the Chairy Orchard to be used for Halloween purchases to create frighteningly endearing public spaces for the Halloween season.

Light and Sound Installation at Wollf's Park

Staff are currently investigating the possibility of installing a light and sound system at Wollf's Park. These systems make use of outdoor microphones to channel sound through a computer processor that then translates that sound into a pattern of light and color using an LED light array. Limbic Media, a technology firm based in Vancouver, BC offers a number of such light and sound products that may be a good fit for the physical space at Wolff's Park. Staff are currently considering an installation that would be a canopy over the park space, making use of the scaffolding offered by the existing light array.

Parks and Recreation Staff estimate a light and sound installation at Wolff's Park could be realized for around \$10,000.00.

RECOMMENDATION

None.

ESTIMATED SCHEDULE OF PROJECT

The S. Bonnie Brae sculpture was installed May 21, 2024. The Kirk Seese mural should be installed by mid-June. Purchases for Halloween, Texas will continue through the Spring, Summer, and Fall. Additional traffic boxes and infrastructure boxes will be wrapped pending funding in the new Fiscal Year from HOT (Hotel Occupancy Tax) funds. The Chairy Orchard and art projects associated with bond funding are several years out in terms of design and completion.

OPERATIONAL IMPACT

Each project will have an anticipated maintenance need. Staff are currently working on determining an inspection and asset management protocol under the updated Public Art Policy that will allow for inspections of larger artwork on an annual basis, leading to more accurate estimates of maintenance needs on a year-to-year basis.

FISCAL INFORMATION

- 1. S. Bonnie Brae Street Sculpture (Project #450013467), \$25,000 budget. Additional funds reallocated for installation-associated costs from existing Public Art accounts. These re-allocated funds totaled \$25,000.00.
- 2. Sycamore Street Mural- (Project #450017474), \$10,000 budget in FY 23-24. Re-allocated \$2,500.00 to support South Bonnie Brae sculpture installation.
- 3. HOT funds: Current HOT Fund allocation for FY 23-24: Chairy Orchard, re-allocated to Halloween expenditures (\$75,000.00. Additional traffic box wraps (\$12,000.00), on hold for present year, so entire balance re-allocated to support South Bonnie Brae sculpture installation. TCA grant matching (\$8,400.00), balance less \$4,600 paid to artists transferred to support South Bonnie Brae sculpture installation. Art maintenance (\$4,600.00), balance less \$300 for Robertson Drive mural repair, transferred to support South Bonnie Bra sculpture installation.



Light and Sound at Wolff's Park


- Staff are exploring installation a sound-responsive light feature at Wolff's park.




