## **SUBJECT**

Receive a report, hold a discussion, and give staff direction on the Fiscal Year 2024-25 preliminary Capital Improvement Program.

## **BACKGROUND**

The purpose of this work session is to provide an update on the preliminary capital improvement program. This work session will review the Preliminary Capital Improvement Budget for FY 2024-25, the highlights of the program in the major funds, an overview of the 2019 and 2023 Bond Programs and the preliminary property tax interest and sinking rate.

# **Total Program:**

• Total program funding, including previously committed funds, totals \$1.15 billion. Of this amount, previously committed funds total \$661.2 million with fiscal year 2024-25 funds preliminarily estimated at \$493.9 million.

#### **General Government:**

- The preliminary requests for General Government funding total \$174.1 million for fiscal year 2024-25. The General Government category includes all Governmental, Special Revenue, and Internal Service Funds. Departments accounted for in General Government include:
  - Fleet & Facilities
  - Technology Services
  - o Public Works
  - Parks
  - o Environmental Services
- Funding sources for General Government include:
  - o General Obligation Bonds
  - o Certificates of Obligation
  - o Revenue Funded Obligations
  - Impact Fees
  - TRiP Funding

#### **Electric Fund:**

The preliminary requests for Electric Fund funding total \$75.02 million for fiscal year 2024-25. Staff are projecting a CO debt issuance of \$69.8 million, a transfer of \$45 thousand from operating, and \$5.1 million from cost sharing.

• Highlights in the Electric Fund include:

- o Feeder Extensions and Improvements: \$15.93M
  - 43 locations/projects identified
- New Residential and Commercial: \$9.20M
  - Hunter/Cole Ranch Line Extension
  - New Business Development
- o Plant Production: \$6.35M
- o Technology & Electric Relocations: \$10.09M

#### Water Fund:

The preliminary requests for Water Fund funding total \$130.4 million for fiscal year 2024-25. Staff are projecting a CO/Revenue Debt issuance of \$130 million and \$431 thousand in vehicle replacement funding.

- Highlights in the Water Fund include:
  - o Plant Improvements: \$78.64M
    - Ray Roberts Water Treatment Plant
- Replacement Lines: \$21.73M
  - Lead and Copper Rule Compliance
  - o Supplement to 2019 Bond Election Projects
- Taps, Fire Hydrants & Meters: \$10.27M

## **Wastewater Fund:**

The preliminary requests for Wastewater Fund funding total \$100.47 million for fiscal year 2024-25. Staff are projecting a CO/Revenue Debt issuance of \$99.25 million and a transfer of \$1.22 million from operating.

- Highlights in the Wastewater Fund include:
  - Lift station Improvements: \$27.24M
    - o Milam Creek Basin Wastewater Line and Lift Station
    - o Cooper Creek Lift Station Improvement Project
    - o Granada Lift Station Replacement

#### **Solid Waste Fund:**

The preliminary requests for Solid Waste Fund funding total \$12.99 million for fiscal year 2024-25. Staff are projecting a CO Debt issuance of \$11.12 million and a transfer of \$1.87 million from operating.

- Highlights in the Solid Waste Fund include:
  - o Structural: \$3.19M
    - Concrete Replacement
    - SW Fleet Building
    - Scale house
  - o Disposal/Landfill: \$4.00M
    - Cell 5 & 6 Construction
  - o Vehicles: \$5.80M
    - Vehicles New Additions
    - Vehicles Replacements
