CHALLENGES: GYM SPACE

UNT PEB & Bahnsen Gyms (6 Courts) are used for practices and games for all indoor sports. UNT was paid out \$83,170 for facility use in 2023-2024.

Without the use of the UNT Gyms, we would only have one court to use at McMath Middle School, leaving our indoor programs non-existent.

UNT has raised their rates starting this year from \$75/hr for the Bahnsen Gym and \$150/hr for the PEB Gyms to \$90/hr for the Bahnsen Gym and \$175/hr for the PEB Gyms.

AIR is a hands-on, fully involved program area, catering to the diverse needs and accommodations of our participants. Many participants require 1:1 or 5:1 ratio, while engaging in the activities; depending upon their disabilities. Due to North Lakes rec center room capacity, our groups are limited to only 30 participants/caregiver in a room at once. Resulting in missed community opportunities.

As the program continues to grow and evolve their will be a need for additional staff, staff training, building resources and funding to support the continued development of this great program.
