SUBJECT

Consider adoption of an ordinance of the City of Denton ratifying the submission of an application to the North Central Texas Council of Governments (NCTCOG) FY 2026 to 2027 Solid Waste Grant Program in the amount of \$25,025 for trash and recycling containers; and providing for an effective date.

BACKGROUND

The Solid Waste Department is seeking \$20,025 in grant funding through the NCTCOG's Fiscal Year 2026 to 2027 Solid Waste Grant Program to purchase and implement standardized trash and recycling sorting waste containers for all City buildings, consistent with the 30TAC 328 Subchapter K requirements. The goal is to enhance waste diversion rates and promote proper recycling practices among City staff.

The proposed containers will be clearly labeled and designed to facilitate the separation of common recyclable materials (e.g., paper, plastic, glass, aluminum) from general waste. A key component of this project is the inclusion of a custom message on each container. This message will be specifically tailored by the Solid Waste and Recycling program to educate users on the correct materials to be placed in each bin, aligning with the City's specific recycling guidelines and program initiatives

Grant applications were due on May 21, 2025. The application requires a resolution within thirty days of the application close date and no later than June 21, 2025, from the governing body authorizing the application submittal as well as receipt of funding if awarded.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends approval of the resolution.
