SUBJECT

Consider adoption of an ordinance of the City of Denton, Texas, updating impact fees by amending Article VI "Impact Fees" of Chapter 26, "Utilities," Sections 26-213, 26-216 through 26-222, and Section 26-228 of the City of Denton Code of Ordinances; adopting revised land use assumptions and capital improvements plans for water and wastewater impact fees; establishing new service areas for water and wastewater impact fees; establishing new maximum impact fees per service unit and impact fees to be collected; revising provisions for the assessment and collection of impact fees; repealing conflicting ordinances and resolutions; providing severability and penalty clauses; and providing an effective date.

STRATEGIC ALIGNMENT

This action supports Key Focus Area: Support Healthy and Safe Communities.

INFORMATION/BACKGROUND

Impact fees provide the means for recovering a portion of the cost of adding capacity to the water and wastewater system to provide service for new growth that creates new demand. Texas Local Government Code Chapter 395 governs the use of impact fees and requires the City to update impact fees at least every five years.

The City of Denton first adopted impact fees for Water and Wastewater Utilities in 1998 and completed updates in 2003, 2008, 2013, and 2018. The current update process began in 2022 and includes updated land use assumptions, population projections, and ten-year Water and Wastewater capital improvement plans (CIP).

Land use assumptions include projections of changes in land uses, densities, and service units in the water and wastewater service areas over the next ten years. These assumptions are used to forecast the timing and mix of developments within each service area. The ten-year Water and Wastewater CIPs identify the capital projects and associated costs required to support growth in the service areas based on the land use assumptions, water and wastewater demand forecasts, hydraulic modeling, and the City's Water and Wastewater Master Plans. This information is used to calculate the cost of providing water or wastewater service to a new customer. This cost becomes the Maximum Impact Fee allowed under Chapter 395. The City Council may choose to collect Water and Wastewater Impact Fees at any amount up to the Maximum Impact Fee.

On June 25, 2025, the Capital Improvements Advisory Committee (CIAC) voted six to zero under CIAC25-006 to recommend collecting the Maximum Impact Fee as identified in the "Water and Wastewater Impact Fee Update, June 2025" study (2025 Impact Fee Update). On July 15, 2025, staff presented the proposed 2025 Impact Fee Update to the City Council during a work session, where 75 percent of the Maximum Impact Fee and an implementation date of January 1, 2026, were discussed and

recommended for consideration. City Council voted six to one to continue with this recommendation for the public hearing. A public hearing, as required by Chapter 395, was held on August 5, 2025, to receive public input. Based on City Council direction during the work session and input from the public hearing, the proposed ordinance reflects 75 percent of the Maximum Impact Fee, effective April 1, 2026.

The land use assumptions and the impact fee eligible projects associated with the ten-year Water and Wastewater capital plans are incorporated into the 2025 Impact Fee Update, which is included as Exhibit A in the attached ordinance. The Impact Fee, CIAC, and City Council direction are summarized below:
