AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF DENTON AUTHORIZING THE SUBMISSION OF AN APPLICATION TO THE STATE OF TEXAS, OFFICE OF THE GOVERNOR, 2026 BULLET-RESISTANT COMPONENTS FOR LAW ENFORCEMENT VEHICLES GRANT PROGRAM FUNDED THROUGH THE US DEPARTMENT OF HOMELAND SECURITY IN THE AMOUNT OF \$378,000 FOR BALLISTIC RESISTANT PANELS; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the State of Texas, Office of the Governor released the notice of funding opportunity for the 2026 Bullet-Resistant Components for Law Enforcement Vehicles, on October 15, 2025; and

WHEREAS, the grant is awarded by the State of Texas, Office of the Governor, and funded by the US Department of Homeland Security for the period of March 1, 2026 through February 28, 2027; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of the grant is to support law enforcement agencies to equip motor vehicles used by peace officers with certain bullet-resistant components; and

WHEREAS, applications for the grant are due on November 20, 2025; and

WHEREAS, the grant will provide necessary equipment to implement bullet-resistant components on police vehicles; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds it in the best interest of the public to apply for the 2026 Bullet-Resistant Components for Law Enforcement Vehicles; NOW THEREFORE,

THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DENTON HEREBY ORDAINS:

- <u>Section 1</u>. The recitals set forth above are found to be true and correct legislative and factual determinations of the City of Denton and are hereby approved and incorporated into the body of this Ordinance and made a part hereof for all purposes as if fully set forth herein.
- <u>Section 2.</u> The application for the 2026 Bullet-Resistant Components for Law Enforcement Vehicles grant program is hereby authorized.
- Section 3. The City Manager or designee is designated, delegated, and authorized to request and accept grant funding under the 2026 grant, including the submission of the grant application, and act on behalf of the City of Denton in all matters related to the grant application and any subsequent grant contracts and grant projects that may result.
- <u>Section 4</u>. The City shall comply with the requirements of the Texas Office of the Governor, the US Department of Homeland Security, and the State of Texas.
- <u>Section 5</u>. The project funds and any project-funded equipment and facilities will be used solely for the purposes for which they are intended under the grant.

<u>Section 6</u>. The City agrees that in the event of loss or misuse of the Office of the Governor funds, the City assures that the funds will be returned to the Office of the Governor in full.

<u>Section 7</u>. This ordinance is effective immediately upon its passage.
