MINUTES CITY OF DENTON DENTON PUBLIC LIBRARY BOARD South Branch Library – October 14, 2024

After determining that a quorum was present, the Denton Public Library Board convened on Monday, October 14, at 5:30 p.m. The meeting was held at the South Branch Library at 3228 Teasley Lane, Denton, Texas.

1. PRESENTATION FROM MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC

Debi Scaggs presented. Donna Smith presented.

2. ITEMS FOR CONSIDERATION

A. LB24-056 Consider approval of the minutes of August 12, 2024.

The Board accepted and approved minutes of the August 12, 2024 meeting. Rebecca Fridley motioned, Kerol Harrod seconded, all in favor.

- **<u>B. LB24-059</u>** The Board received an informational report regarding the Friends of the Denton Public Libraries.
 - The Friends are celebrating National Friends of Libraries Week, October 20-16, with a proclamation to be read at the October 15, 2024, City Council meeting as well as social media messaging to promote membership and engagement.
- <u>C. LB24-058</u> The Board received an informational report regarding the Emily Fowler Library Foundation.
 - There have been no changes since the last Library Board meeting. Library staff is coordinating with Foundation Trustees to schedule a Fall meeting.

D. LB24-060 The Board received a report, held a discussion, and considered approval of the following Denton Public Library Policy update:

• *Program Operating Policy* – The Board accepted and approved the policy update with amendment to retain the statement that library

cards are not required to attend programs (page 4). Rebecca Fridley motioned, Ling Jeng seconded, all in favor

<u>E. LB24-057</u> The Board received an information report and held a discussion regarding:

Library Facility Projects – North Branch facility projects are complete, with all exterior, roof, and trim work finished in September. Emily Fowler Central Library projects are mostly complete, with final interior and exterior paint touch ups and carpet punch list issues being addressed in October. Staff and Facilities department continue to work with carpet vendor to address issues with floor vents at Fowler. The Municipal Archive move project at Fowler is also happening in October and November. Most of the archival materials have moved upstairs into the old study rooms and staff workroom. Quotes for the removal of the old study room countertops and a large island workstation in the upstairs workroom are being requested. Additionally, a quote to remove cabinets in the downstairs work area has been requested to move the Outreach Librarian from North Branch to Emily Fowler Central Library. Furniture for the new Emily Fowler Central Library study rooms has been delayed due to vendor communication issues but is anticipated to arrive in December.

Land Acquisition – City Council approved the purchase of 14.434 acres of land located along Ryan Road for the future new South Branch Library. The contract is in place and Real Estate is finalizing the transaction. The land was purchased with Library and Parks bond funds as the library will be on approximately 5 acres of land and the remainder will include green space, trails, and a possible co-located City facility after further analysis and public input.

Denton Halloween – The City of Denton's month-long Halloween celebration kicked off on October 1. Events are planned daily throughout October. Most activities and decorations will be centered around the downtown square, with participation from various City, community, and local business entities. The library is hosting Halloween events at all its branches, offered a special limited-edition Denton Halloween library card, and features themed displays and photo opportunities at the branches. More details are available at www.dentonhalloween.com.

2024 Summer Reading Challenge – The 2024 Summer Reading Challenge (SRC) reports a total of 2,073 people registered for SRC and 1,192 people, 57.5% of registrants, completed the program by reading at least 5 hours. Denton community members read 2.13 million minutes in June and July.

FY 24-25 Budget – The City's fiscal year is October 1-September 30. The library received an increase to offset the rising costs for public use databases and online learning resources as well as an increase in funding for hoopla® digital services in FY24/25.

South Branch Library Youth Area – The children's play area in the South Branch Library will be adding an imaginative play kitchen, stand, or other play structure and expand the educational toys available for children. The library supports play as learning. Play helps children develop language, critical thinking, social, and executive function skills.

- **<u>E. LB24-061</u>** Received an informational report and held a discussion regarding the Denton Public Library's digital collections:
 - Denton Public Library offers digital collections from three different platforms. Digital collections include eBooks, digital audiobooks, downloadable music, and streaming TV and movies. Jennifer Bekker, Director of Libraries provided a demonstration and overview of CloudLibrary[™], hoopla® digital services, and Lightbox® Learning. The presentation contains FY23/24 library use summaries for CloudLibrary[™] and hoopla®.





The Friends of the Denton Public Libraries is a nonprofit organization that supports the Denton Public Library through community service and fundraising to provide materials and equipment to improve and extend Library services. This report provides an update on the organization's activities and fundraising efforts.

A proclamation for National Friends of the Library Week was read at the October 15, 2024 City Council meeting. The Friends Executive Board met on Thursday, October 10, 2024. The draft of the Friends meeting minutes is attached as Exhibit 2. The November 16, 2024 Big Book Sale earned a record setting \$5,002 in sales.

FRIENDS OF THE DENTON PUBLIC LIBRARIES

MINUTES FOR THE OCTOBER 10, 2024 MEETING

The quarterly meeting of the Board was held on October 10 at the North Branch Library and was called to order at 5:30 P.M.

Board Members in attendance were: Teri Lupo, President; Nancy Kamman; Corrie Pelc, Communications Director; Jennifer Bekker, Director of Libraries, ex officio member; Carol Nance; Eva Poole, Treasurer; Linda Touraine, Recording Secretary; Ray Stephens, Phillip Baker, and Joyce Bray.

Board Members not in attendance: Barbara Reiser, Vice President, Richard Bryson, Membership Director, Tom Reedy and Linda Burke.

Others in attendance: Haley Phillips, Library Outreach Coordinator

The minutes for the July 11, 2024 meeting had been circulated to the board members via email. Eva made a motion to accept the minutes as circulated that was seconded by Nancy.

Eva Poole, Treasurer, gave her financial report covering July 1, 2024 through September 30, 2024 activities. The beginning balance as of June 28, 2024 was \$40,504.29; the income for the 3rd quarter was \$7,817.57; disbursements for the 3rd quarter were \$9,547.30; leaving a bank balance of \$38,774.56 on September 30, 2024. Eva mentioned that the quarterly book sales and the Karaoke purchase made through PayPal will increase the projects total income by \$829.89 and \$75.00 respectively when those funds are transferred to the Friends bank account. There were no questions regarding the report. The report will be filed for audit and will be attached to the minutes

President Teri Lupo reported the Quarterly Book Sale dates needed to set for 2025. The following dates were accepted and approved by the Library Director: February 8, May 10, August 9, and November 8. Dates for the quarterly board meetings still need to be determined. Teri mentioned that she had been notified that the Agreement between the City of Denton and the Friends of the Denton Public Libraries is up for renewal. Jennifer, Library Director, added a few changes needed to be updated and it shortly would be ready for signatures.

Barbara Reiser, Vice-President, and Manager of Book Store, was not in attendance but she had sent a short report. The bookstore is doing well and is ready for the Fall. She also reported that Emily Fowler had donated 79 Early Reader Program books that were sold for \$3.00 each and purchases were limited to ten per sale. Thus far, the sales have brought in \$207.00. Teri announced that the bookstore will be closed on Monday, December 23.

Jennifer Bekker, Director of Libraries, reported that the North Branch updates are complete. The Emily Fowler updates are still in progress. There has been a delay in ordering the furniture for the conference room and study rooms due to the vendor. The Municipal Archive Collection is being

moved to the upper level. Furniture arrangements are being made in the lower-level work area to relocate the Outreach Librarian to Emily Fowler. Jennifer reported the new South Branch land acquisition is complete. Zoning and PADA agreement adjustments with the planning department will begin in 2025; design scheduled for FY25/26; and construction set for FY26/27 and FY27/28. The library order 500 limited edition Halloween cards for the city's month-long Halloween Events and Activities. The cards were all requested within the first nine days of October. Jennifer lastly gave an update on the progress of the 2024 Library funding requests. She distributed a sheet showing most of the projects are complete with a few only waiting on the final paperwork so payment may be made to the library. Board members to receive the 2025 Library projects requests in October via email.

Haley Phillips, Library Outreach Coordinator, showed and described a proposed project for the 2025 year. The library would provide Story Time Totes to 5-6 state certified Family Child-Care Providers in Denton during the school year. The pilot program would have 15 totes with different themes to rotate among the family child-care facilities. Each tote would contain picture books, board books, finger plays, some activities with needed materials to complete. It is estimated the project would serve over 50 children per month. Haley also showed a sample sheet that could be prepared for Denton listing Senior Services, Community and Wellness Resources, Benefits Counseling, Housing Repairs, Meal Assistance. Etc. These would be put in the Adult Memory Kits for the library customer to keep.

Richard Bryson, Membership Director, was not in attendance but sent an email report. Richard stated he had done an email membership campaign in September that went to 385 former members and only 5 renewed. Total current membership is 241 which is up slightly from the last quarter since there had been good response at the August book sale. Richard also announced he is wanting to step down from Membership and is looking for a replacement.

Corrie Pelc, Communications Director, provided her report to the board prior to the meeting. Facebook followers continue with a steady increase and we now have 1,290. The Summer Newsletter went out in early August prior to the August Book Sale. Nearly 55% of the recipients opened it. The Fall Newsletter will go out prior to the November Book Sale. Corrie reported she had sent out two eblasts in September about the North Texas Giving Day; however, we did not hit our \$1,000 goal. She did not have the final figures to report yet. The 1st Saturday Book Donation Drives are increasing and getting us books for the book sale and the book store. Corrie worked with the City of Denton to get a proclamation presented during National Friends of the Libraries Week at the City Council meeting on October 15.

Under New Business:

Teri announced that Linda Burke was resigning from the board as well as not working the Book Store any more. Teri presented information on Bonnie McCormick as a replacement for Linda B. Board members approved Bonnie as a new board member.

Eva presented information on the Rotary project to present books to Kinder and PreK DISD students in 2025 and asked for the Friends support. The Friends made a monetary donation in

last year's project. Phillip made a motion that the Friends do a donation of \$1,000 to the Rotary's Road to Reading project for 2025. Nancy seconded.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 6:24 P.M. on the motion of Teri, seconded by Philip.

BACKGROUND

Emily Fowler Central Library study rooms are now open to the public. The facility project was completed in October. Furniture was delivered in late November and the rooms were opened for use on December 2, 2024.

Library staff are identifying 15-18 initiatives as the 2025 Annual Action Items as part of the library's Strategic Plan. 2024 Action Items that are one-year initiatives are being closed out in December. Multi-year initiatives will roll over and continue in 2025.

There have been several staffing changes due to retirements and new professional opportunities elsewhere. The full-time Library Specialist position at North Branch was recently filled. Two Youth Services Librarians begin the second week of December, with one at Emily Fowler Central Library and one at South Branch Library. A Teen Librarian position is now open at North Branch. A part-time Library Assistant position recently closed, and interviews are being scheduled in December.

The Texas State Library and Archives Commission (TSLAC) is in the process of updating minimum accreditation criteria for public libraries. Some proposed changes that would affect Denton Public Library include creating a new Information Security and Privacy Policy and additional professional development training requirements for the Director of Libraries. Discussions and feedback sessions are currently taking place and public libraries would have until 2026 to meet the updated requirements. The annual Winter Reading Program kicked off December 1, 2024, and runs through January 31, 2025. The initiative promotes literacy, encourages the development of a love of reading, and supports lifelong learning.

Nanya Jackson, Youth Services Librarian at South Branch Library, has been awarded a \$3,388 grant from the Denton Benefit League to develop and offer STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, and Math) related programs for teens. The grant will cover furniture and supplies for teen robotics, engineering and art programs in the Spring and Summer of 2025. Haley Phillips, Outreach Librarian, is planning to apply for a \$3,000 Light the Way grant to provide funding for an initiative to support early literacy. The initiative would create Story Totes with complete Story Time supplies, books, and program instructions to local home daycares. The initiative also includes an aspect of early literacy education to home daycare providers to provide them with best practices for reading activities and how to incorporate reading with children into their daily schedules.
