COMPANY BACKGROUND

- 1966: Mayday Manufacturing was created by James H. Nelson.
 - World leader in build-to-print manufacturing of aerospace bushings, pins, sleeves, and turned metal parts
- 2016: Acquired by Esco Technologies alongside captive plating shop Hi-Tech Metal Finishing
- 2022: Hi-Tech was absorbed by Mayday, now serving as the processing division


Incentive Request

- Originally incentivized in 2012 (Ordinance #: 2012-045)
 - \$8.5 million expansion
 - 75% rebate on ad valorem taxes above base valuation
 - Completed in 2022 lacksquare
- In March 2025, Staff received an incentive application from Mayday Manufacturing for their new expansion.
 - Due to increased demand, Mayday is looking to expand their facility footprint by ~45k square feet
 - Plan to break ground in July 2025
 - **Completion estimated between December** 2026-February 2027



CONSIDERATION

- Consider adoption of an ordinance approving an economic development agreement under Chapter 380 of the local government code for an amount not to exceed \$577,944
 - Ad valorem tax rebate of 60% for 10 years on new business personal and real property and an expansion grant of \$25,000.
- Economic Development Partnership Board approved May 14, 2025 (11-0-1).
