SUBJECT

Consider approval of a resolution of the City of Denton repealing Policy No. 200.01 Barricading City Streets due to updated Texas and National traffic control standards.; and declaring an effective date.

STRATEGIC ALIGNMENT

This action supports Key Focus Area: Not Applicable. The repeal of this policy aids in ensuring that our policy library is up to date with current State and Federal guidelines. Policy No. 200.01 Barricading City Streets is no longer applicable.

INFORMATION

The City's Code of Ordinances, Section 2-28, "Policies, Procedures, and Directives," establishes the definitions and approval processes for policy documents. The City of Denton maintains two types of policy documents: Policies and Administrative Directives.

- **Policies** must be adopted and approved by the City Council. A "Policy" means a statement of overall philosophy and direction, describing goals to be accomplished and programs to be established. To revise a Policy Statement, the City Council must approve the revision.
- **Administrative Directives** are approved and issued by the City Manager to city employees to establish rules and regulations concerning internal operational matters. Administrative Directives do not require City Council review or approval for enactment or revision.

BACKGROUND

Originally adopted on July 30, 1984, this policy is being proposed for repeal with no budgetary implications. The repeal was presented to the Policy Review Committee on August 7, 2025, with no objections. Current traffic control standards are governed by the Texas Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (TMUTCD) and the national Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD). All work conducted in the Right of Way (ROW) requires permits, with traffic control plans reviewed, approved, and inspected in accordance with the ROW ordinance. Over time, the implementation of national standards and local ordinances has evolved to encompass all aspects of the policy, making it no longer specific to the City of Denton but a requirement for all municipalities.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends approval of the resolution.
