## **Roadway Classification Definitions**

Residential	Associated with residential development within an urban and/or suburban environment. <b>55 feet of total ROW</b> EXAMPLE: Mistywood Lane Typical speeds: 25 – 30 mph	
Collector	Collects traffic from residential streets and local commercial and industrial streets and connects to Arterials. <b>65 feet of total ROW</b> EXAMPLE: Stuart Road  Typical speeds: 30 – 35 mph	
NEW TYPE: Major Collector	Collects traffic from residential streets and local commercial and industrial streets and connects to Arterials. Provides for greater pedestrian and bicycle connectivity. 110 feet of total ROW  Anticipated speed: 35 mph	
Secondary Arterial	Major routes throughout the city. The number of driveway connections are limited to reduce friction and allow traffic to flow. <b>110 feet of total ROW</b> EXAMPLE: Sherman Drive Typical speeds: 35 – 40 mph	
Primary Arterial	Major routes throughout the city and county. The number of driveway connections are limited to reduce friction and allow traffic to flow. <b>135 feet of total ROW</b> EXAMPLE: University Drive Typical speeds: 40 – 45 mph
