BACKGROUND

During the June 7th Sustainability Framework Advisory Committee (SFAC) Meeting Chair Briggs requested an update about adding an item for speakers at Committee meetings.

Staff reviewed the City Council Rules of Procedure, Denton City Code 2-29, and processes in place for other City of Denton Boards and Commissions and identified two options to add a standing item for citizen/public comment to future Sustainability Framework Advisory Committee Agendas if approved by the Committee.

The City of Denton Boards and Commissions that allow citizen/public comment generally follow one of the examples below.

Mobility Committee Example

CITIZEN COMMENTS ON AGENDA ITEMS: This section of the agenda allows citizens to speak on any individual consideration item on the agenda. Individuals are only able to comment one time per agenda item. Each speaker will be given a total of three (3) minutes per agenda item. A Request to Speak Card must be completed and returned to the Staff Liaison before the Committee considers the item.

Library Board Example

PRESENTATION FROM MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC: This section of the agenda permits a person to make comments regarding public business on items not listed on the agenda. This is limited to two speakers per meeting with each speaker allowed a maximum of four (4) minutes.

To add a standing public comment item to the SFAC agenda we first must identify procedures for public comment.

What topic can be addressed during the comment period?

The Mobility Committee allows citizens to speak on any individual consideration item on the agenda.

The Library Board permits comments regarding public business on items not listed on the agenda.

How many speakers will be allowed each meeting?

The Mobility Committee does not have a limit on the number of speakers, but individuals may comment only one time per agenda item.

The Library Board limits comments to two speakers per meeting.

The Boards and Commissions that allow public comment generally allow a minimum of 2 and a maximum of 7 speakers.

How long will each speaker have to address the Committee?

The Mobility Committee allows 3 minutes for each speaker per agenda item.

The Library Board allows 4 minutes per speaker.

Staff will coordinate with both City Secretary's Office and Legal Department to implement an approved process.

SUBJECT: First Quarter Education Report

From October 1, 2024 to December 31, 2024, Sustainability staff organized 45 outreach events. Staff tabled at Trunk or Treat, Halloween Harvest, and pop-ups at North Lakes Recreation Center and Emily Fowler Library. Activities from the quarter include Pollinator Pals, Recycling Bingo, and Sustainability Trivia Nights. Tours were conducted of Pratt Recycling, Inc., Home Chemical Collection, and the Lake Ray Roberts Water Treatment Plant. Meetings were facilitated with schools to ensure they are equipped to provide education on waste diversion. Presentations covered a variety of topics that highlighted focus areas of the Sustainability Framework such as water, energy conservation and efficiency, air quality, material resources management, land use and open/natural spaces, and resiliency and public health.

SUBJECT: Denton’s Bird City Texas Certification

The City of Denton has been certified as a Bird City by Bird City Texas for 2025-2027. Bird City Texas is a program, created in 2018, by Audubon Texas and the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department that recognizes leadership in habitat conservation, threat reduction, and community engagement for birds. A few of the City’s actions commended during the application review included the number of social media posts, the reach those posts, the number of outreach events hosted, the snag SOP followed by Parks & Recreation (dead trees remain standing, where public safety allows, to be used as bird habitat), education provided to residents about reducing bird window collisions, the number of and participation in youth classes, bird or wildlife focused education classes, and Denton’s alternative transportation options. Denton’s efforts have earned a place as one of 15 certified communities throughout the state of Texas.

This achievement was accomplished with the collaboration of multiple City departments including Animal Services, Denton Public Library, Denton Municipal Electric, Parks & Recreation, and Environmental Services & Sustainability as well as outside organizations including the University of North Texas, Texas Woman’s University, and the Elm Fork Texas Master Naturalists.

SUBJECT: City of Denton Inflation Reduction Act Grants

At the August 23, 2024 Sustainability Framework Advisory Committee Meeting Chair Soph asked if the City of Denton had received any IRA grants.

The City of Denton has directly applied for 2 grants funded through the IRA program and none have been awarded.

The City of Denton has supported regional grant applications submitted by the North Central Texas Council of Governments (NCTCOG) and may have the opportunity to benefit from projects and/or receive sub-grants.

- NCTCOG - \$70 million award from the Federal Highway Administration to build 5 hydrogen fueling stations around Texas
- NCTCOG - \$60 million award from the EPA Clean Heavy-Duty Vehicle Program

SUBJECT: Fiscal Year 2024-2025 Incentives update

Fiscal Year 2024-2025 Incentive Program updates went into effect October 1, 2024 and rebates are being processed using the approved incentive requirements and funding.

Staff will provide quarterly updates to the Sustainability Framework Advisory Committee (SFAC) regarding applications and expenditures. Staff will report the number of applications received, expenses recorded in the City financial system, pending expenditures based on rebates in process, and a list of the most frequently processed rebates from the previous quarter.

Environmental Services and Sustainability staff received and processed 122 total incentive applications between October 1, 2024 and December 31, 2024.
