



Construction Team

Over the past quarter the Park Maintenance Construction Team were heavily involved with the construction of placemaking props for Denton Halloween as well as performing their regular maintenance duties. They constructed 400' of cemetery fencing assisted in building 100 tombstones, 500 bats and were tasked with building other support structures to enhance the Denton Halloween experience.









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Irrigation Team

During the past quarter, the Irrigation Team wrapped up another difficult summer dealing with drought and record high temperatures. They have recently winterized irrigation systems throughout the system and are currently working with the construction and electrical team to install the underground utilities within the Denia Softball Complex. This group were also vital contributors in the Denton Halloween effort providing manpower in the installation, maintenance and removal of the decorations in the downtown area.






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Electrical Team







- Removal of invasive Chinese Privet from up to 230 acres of natural areas in parks including Cross Timbers Forest and Environmentally Sensitive Areas to preserve native forest, and restoration native habitat with the planting of native ground cover and up to 20,000 understory shrubs and trees to reduce the occurrence of re-infestation of privet.
- Education of the public about the importance of urban forestry.
