WHEREAS, the National Day of Prayer was first declared in 1775 when the Continental Congress appealed to the colonies to pray for wisdom in forming this nation, and on May 5, 1988, President Ronald Reagan set forth the first Thursday of May of each year as a National Day of Prayer; and
