Community Event Center Project


- The Community Event Center Project was a Council priority item discussed as part of FY 2015-16 budget.
- Request from DCM for new space/permanent facility.
- Project evolved into Community Event Center to:
 - Add additional parking for downtown events
 - Add additional venue/event space for community
 - Provide a neighborhood amenity and serve as a catalyst for redevelopment in area



Community Event Center Project

- FY 2015-16 Approved Project Budget
 - \$405,000 in CO's for parking lot demolition and reconstruction
 - > \$253,000 for site amenities
 - > \$150,000 in HOT funds
 - > \$103,000 in General Fund





Council Community Event Center Committee

- Committee appointed by Council to facilitate the development of the event center, create any necessary policies, and to consider naming of the center.
- Committee has provided direction or is in discussion on:
 - Project goals
 - Lease terms and ROI*
 - Design process
 - Project timeline
 - Real estate

- Parking impacts
- DCM competitive market analysis and operations



Council Community Event Center Committee

- Committee has not discussed rental guidelines for event center
 - DCM operates between April and November and site would not be available to others during those times
 - Approx. 7 a.m. to 3 p.m. for 35 Saturdays
 - For other events: Possible consideration of restrictions for certain times/days of the week and/or types of events



Council Community Event Center Committee

- Committee has worked with design firm to develop a concept design for the event center
 - External and internal stakeholders were involved in a design process
 - Designer took into account needs and wants of both the City and DCM to establish design








Concept Design

- Design is a "master plan" design
- Reflects industrial feel of area
- Design includes:
 - > 138 parking spaces (currently ~80 spaces)
 - Covered parking under structure
 - Flex parking for food trucks
 - Custom market pavilion
 - Permanent restroom facilities
 - Welcome monument
 - Space for 144 vendor booths

Parking

- Parking demand being generated by close proximity of:
 - City Hall East
 - Public Safety Training Center
 - Euline Brock Transit Center
 - Railyard Development
 - East End Lofts at the Railyard
 - Community Event Center



Parking

- Future expansion of Public Safety Training Center
- Possible relocation of Customer Service to DATCU building
- Finish out of Stoke and restaurant/retail space in Railyard
- Apartments open to residents



Railyard Parking

- Railyard was provided a 25% parking reduction due to offset parking demand created by mixed-uses.
 - > 259 to 194 parking spaces
 - 40 spaces adjacent to Railyard building are designated for office use. Remainder are open parking spaces.
- Railyard does not have a shared parking agreement with the City.

| Departments | Spaces Needed (Staff Only) | Additional Spaces for External Customers |
|-------------------------|---|--|
| Human Resources | H | 30 |
| Parks & Recreation | 10 | 10 |
| Tech Services | 28 | 5 |
| CIS & Comm. Development | 21 | 4 |
| Customer Service | 45 | 32 (avg. for ½ hour period) |
| Municipal Court | 10 | 50 |
| Police Department | 150 (includes equipment and staff vehicles) | 100 |
| TOTAL | 275 | 231 |



Parking Space Count

- ~200 spaces on PD side of City Hall East
- ~120 spaces on HR side of City Hall East
- ~12 street parking spaces on Railroad Ave.
- ~ 20 street parking spaces on Hickory (South side)
- ~15 street parking spaces on Hickory (North side)
- ~367 total staff/public spaces without Exposition Lot
- Exposition Lot currently has about ~80 spaces
 - =447 total
- Reconstructed Exposition Lot ~138 spaces
 - =505 total







Parking for Denton Community Market


- Evaluation of all possible parking locations

 - Alternative Modes of Transportation














Other Parking Factors

- Off-set parking demand
- Proximity to Euline Brock Transit Center
 - Encourage use of alternative modes of transportation
- Katy Trail access
- Hickory Street corridor
- Bike Improvements in area
- Pedestrian improvements in area
- Trail connectivity with splash park at Carl Young Park
