

Environmental Services Department Goals and Accomplishments

Accomplishments for 16-17:

- 1. Completed remediation for TCEQ's Voluntary Cleanup Plan at 300 East McKinney Street.
- 2. Denton was first recipient of the integrated Stormwater Management (iSWM) "Silver" designation from NCTCOG
- 3. Completed sampling and analyses for Pecan Creek Plant phosphorus reduction/treatment program.
- 4. Improved GIS, database management, and tracking for On-Site Sanitary Sewer Facilities (OSSFs).

Goals for 17-18:

- 1. Finish 301 East McKinney Street property remediation through TCEQ's Voluntary Cleanup Plan.
- 2. Continue to improve energy and water audit program, including evaluations of effectiveness.
- 3. Complete revisions to Subchapter 17 of the Development Code (Environmentally Sensitive Areas).
- 4. Meet new stormwater inspection requirements by cross training staff in pretreatment division.

Current Performance Measures:

- 1. Decrease in municipal energy usage
- 2. Percent of non-solar energy rebate funding used from base amount
- 3. Percent of solar energy rebate funding used from base amount
- 4. Percent of renewable energy used in municipal facilities

Proposed Performance Measures:

- 1. Number of active construction sites inspected per week
- 2. Number of grease trap inspections per year
- 3. Number of Pretreatment enforcement actions for regulated industries
- 4. Number of activities and participation rate at Clear Creek Natural Heritage Center
- 5. Number of energy and water audits

Environmental Services Department Cost Containment Strategies

Summary of Department efforts:

Removed proposed 0.75 FTE by cross training Pretreatment and Watershed (Savings of \$45,685).

Budgeted salary savings of \$44,364 for turnover and vacancies.

Reduced FY 2017 to FY 2018 budget by \$189,063.

Environmental Services Department Process Improvements

Completed Projects:

- 1. Completed staff training, standard operating procedure, and data management for stormwater annual reports.
- 2. Cross trained stormwater and pretreatment personnel to perform multiple inspections at one site
- 3. Continued to implement and improve Laboratory Information Management System
- 4. Purchased new laboratory instruments to improve efficiency and accuracy
- 5. Obtained software training (spreadsheet server) to more efficiently manage data

Future Projects:

- 1. Improve sustainability plan reporting through new data management approaches.
- 2. Complete evaluation and implement improvements for stormwater development review.
- 3. Upgrade construction site stormwater inspection software.
- 4. Increase digital compliance reporting to regulatory agencies (as possible).
- 5. Continually improve asset management program.
