Accomplishments for 16-17

- Hosted first open streets event, CycloDia
- Assisted with TxDOT turnback of FM 428/McKinney St
- Assumed leadership role with NCTCOG Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Committee
- Received federal reimbursement funding for Active Transportation and Safe Routes to Schools projects
- Coordinated with TxDOT to include 10' multi-use sidepath on US 380 from Mayhill to the Greenbelt

Goals for 17-18

- Attain Bicycle Friendly Community designation from league of American Bicyclists
- Update Pedestrian and Bicycle Linkage Component of Denton Mobility Plan
- Expand partnership opportunities with Denton County, DCTA and TxDOT for mobility enhancements
