- TxDOT needs a decision on type of lighting
- City staff has calculated estimated costs for lighting
- Legal staff has prepared draft agreements


# Safety vs. Continuous

### Safety Lighting


- Required to be installed
- 114 lamps
- 56 wallpacks
- Paid by TxDOT
- Estimated \$10,500 per year to operate


### **Continuous Lighting**


- Not required
- 278 lamps
- 56 wallpacks
- Paid by City of Denton
- Estimated \$20,600 per year to operate






# Safety vs. Continuous

### Safety Lighting

Estimated savings of \$20,600 per year as compared to continuous lighting

### **Continuous Lighting**

- Safer driving conditions
  - Increase nighttime visibility
  - Lower night-to-day accident ratio
- Cities South of Denton have chosen continuous lighting
- Additional visibility for law enforcement personnel and highway work

# TxDOT Highway Illumination Manual

### Safety Lighting

- Requires lighting to be installed at:
  - Interchanges
  - Intersections
  - Other points of nighttime hazard

### **Continuous Lighting**

- Provides uniform illumination on:
  - All main lanes
  - All direct connections
- Complete lighting for all interchanges

# Benefits of Continuous Lighting

- Safer driving conditions
  - Increase nighttime visibility
  - Lower night-to-day accident ratio
- Cities South of Denton have chosen continuous lighting
- Additional visibility for law enforcement personnel and for highway work
