**Re:** Summary of proposed rate changes for the 2017-2018 budget

The following table summarizes changes to the average residential utility bill as a result of the Denton Municipal Electric (DME), Solid Waste, Wastewater, and Water rate changes proposed in the 2017-2018 budget. The rate information contained in this table has been presented to the Public Utility Board during the last two months as a part of departmental budget presentations. For Denton, the average residential bill represents a monthly usage of 1,300 kilowatt-hours of electricity, 9,200 gallons of water, 6,000 gallons of wastewater, and the use of standard solid waste and recycling carts.

<sup>1</sup> FY 2017-18 and FY 2016-17 includes an Energy Cost Adjustment (ECA) rate of \$0.0341 and \$0.0361 respectively.

DME includes an overall 1.0 % decrease for all rate schedules, which results in a 1.2% decrease for average residential customers. This is accomplished by reducing the Energy Cost Adjustment (ECA). The Transmission Cost Recovery Factor (TCRF) will increase by \$0.00067 for customers billed on kWh only. Water, Wastewater, and Solid Waste rates will remain unchanged.
