BACKGROUND

1. Follow up on TWU Women in Business Grants



Parks and Recreation Department staff confirmed that an amphitheater is not on any of their project lists. Rayzor Ranch Town Center is planning a central courtyard with a raised performance stage and seating. The space will be programmed by RED Development and will offer performance opportunities for a wide variety of groups and artists from Denton and surrounding areas.
