BACKGROUND

In November 2020, the Denton County Transportation Authority (DCTA) approved the development of TRiP funding with an objective to provide financial assistance to DCTA member cities for transit-supportive projects consistent with and beneficial to DCTA's Long-Range Service Plan Goals. The City of Denton, the City of Highland Village, and the City of Lewisville makeup the current member cities. Additionally, projects must meet the following criteria for eligibility:

- Located primarily:
 - Within the DCTA service area along existing or planned fixed routes/on-demand zones, or;
 - o The geographic boundaries of DCTA member cities, or;
 - Within a quarter mile of any A-Train Station or DCTA fixed bus route.
 - One mile for sidewalks along existing or planned fixed routes / on-demand zones
- Demonstrate the project is financially sound:

TRiP is a five-year program with the first funding cycle beginning in FY 2021. DCTA issues a call for projects in January of each calendar year. The annual TRiP budget is set at 15 percent of DCTA's net available fund balance from the previous fiscal year. Five percent of the annual TRiP program budget is set aside for DCTA program administration and the remaining 95 percent is divided among member cities proportional to sales and use tax receipts for the previous fiscal year.

DCTA has a budget allocation of \$5,589,560.00 for the City of Denton in FY 2023.

City of Denton staff-initiated planning efforts to identify and prioritize eligible TRiP projects. One of the criteria considered included opportunities to enhance current capital improvement plan (CIP) projects in areas with a high concentration of pedestrian activity, as well as projects where supplemental funding was needed. The following projects are recommended for submission. Exhibits 2 and 3 provide further detail on each project.

WHEREAS, DCTA has a budgeted allocation of \$5,589,560 for the City of Denton in FY 2023.

WHEREAS, the City has identified and prioritized eligible projects for TRiP funding based on enhanced connectivity and accessibility in areas with a high concentration of pedestrian activity; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds it in the public interest to authorize the City Manager, to apply for TRiP funds for the FY 2023 funding period; NOW, THEREFORE,

THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DENTON HEREBY RESOLVES:

SECTION 1. The application for the TRiP Grant Program 2023 is hereby authorized.

SECTION 2. The City will comply with all requirements set forth by the DCTA TRiP policy.

SECTION 3. In the event of loss or misuse of TRiP funds, the City assures that the funds will be returned to DCTA in accordance with the TRiP policy.

SECTION 4. The City Manager, or designee, is the City's designated, authorized official, with the power to apply for, accept, reject, alter or terminate the program on behalf of the City and to take any additional action in connection with the program that the City Manager, or designee, deems most appropriate and in the best interest of the City.

SUBJECT: Committee Requested Project Updates

This memo provides information and updates from Staff relating to updates to the Committee on items of interest discussed in past meetings. The following is a listing and brief staff response to the matters brought forward.

• Bonnie Brae Street Update:

During the final inspection of the project and creation of the punch-list items to be completed, leaks were found on 2 service line connections to the 16-inch line installed as part of the North-South Watermain PH 3 project. This caused damage to the subgrade and temporary pavement along the southbound lanes south of the Scripture Roundabout to Oak Street. The contractor has since fixed the leaks and completed the subgrade repairs. Pavement repairs are underway and are expected to be complete by the end of March, weather permitting.

Bonnie Brae Phase 3 (Roselawn Drive to I-35) was bid in November 2022. Capital Projects requested the bids be rejected due to design issues that were uncovered during the bid process that created unexpected pricing fluctuations. The rejection of bids was approved by PUB on 1/23/23 and City Council on 1/24/23. The Design and plan issues have been addressed and staff is in the process of finalizing the CSP documentation to re-advertise as a Competitive Sealed Proposal (CSP) in April 2023.

Bonnie Brae Phase 6 (US-380 to US-77) is on track to advertise for bid pending the completion of Right of Way (ROW) acquisitions in early Q2 2023. Both Bonnie Brae Phase 3 and Phase 6 have an approximately 2-year construction timeline and are anticipated to be completed by Q3 of 2025

• Hickory Creek Road Phase 3 Update:

The Hickory Creek Road Phase 3 project (Riverpass Drive to FM 1830) is currently in the process of active construction. The project was awarded to Mario Sinacola & Sons with a two-year construction timeline and estimated completion in Q1 2025. Staff is currently coordinating with Denton County that is reconstructing Hilltop Road from Macaway Drive to FM 1830 that is projected to finish in Q3.
